

How to Stencil Your Racquet

Please note that due to the design of some of the stencils, it may be necessary to have additional plastic attachments connecting the inside areas of the stencil to the outside of the stencil. This will in no way affect the ultimate look of the stencil on your strings.

You will notice that your stencil has arrow cutouts in the top and bottom or left and right of the stencil. These are to aid in the layout of the design on the strings. Using the arrows, place the stencil on the strings where desired. Note that if your stencil design contains the additional plastic attachments try to place these in between the strings so that the strings can be inked.

Shake the Racquet Art Stencil Ink container vigorously for at least 30 seconds to mix the ink. Remove the cover and push down the felt tip onto a paper towel or newspaper folded over a few times to load the ink into the felt tip applicator.

While holding the stencil in place, run the felt tip applicator of the Racquet Art Stencil Ink over the exposed strings. Ensure that all the strings inside the stencil are coated in ink. When the applicator seems to run dry, gently squeeze the Racquet Art Stencil Ink container to reload the applicator with ink.

When finished applying the ink to the first side of the racquet, remove the stencil from the strings. Turn the racquet AND the stencil over. You MUST flip the stencil when you turn over the racquet. Lay the stencil on the strings aligning the arrows from step 1 with the same strings used during that step. Once aligned, repeat the inking of the strings as you did in Step 3 on the first side of the racquet.

Remove the stencil from the strings. If your design had any plastic attachments, fill in these areas on the strings with the Racquet Art Stencil Ink. You are now done!
